



Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS) Program

Are you seeking assistance for child care?

The Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS) program is designed to help low income families afford safe quality child care.

To qualify for CAPS you must meet the following requirements:

- Be a Georgia resident
- Be the parent or responsible adult needing care for child(ren) who are U.S. citizens
- Need care for child(ren) under age 13
- Participation in a state approved activity for a minimum average of 24 hours per week which may include:
 - Employment
 - Vocational Training
 - Education (for clients under the age of 21 enrolled in middle or high school or full-time GED program.

If you qualify, priority consideration may be given to families under certain conditions (e.g. teen parents, special needs children, social services cases, grand-parents age 60 etc.)

- Proof of Residence
- Verification of school/training
- Verification of employment
- Verification of child's citizenship
